Ulcers are only visible by gastroscopy (stomach scope) and the signs can be subtle but impact the health of your horse significantly.

Do any of these signs sound familiar?
Dull hair coat
Behaviour changes
Failure to thrive
Poor appetite
Decreased performance
Intermittent colic

Stomach ulcers are common in athletic horses, but can be variable in severity and location. Gastroscopy of the stomach assists veterinarians, owners and trainers to detect the presence and extent of any gastric ulceration.
